

THIRTY-FIFTH REPORT OF THE SALARIES REVIEW COMMISSION

Review of Travelling Facilities applicable to Office-holders within the purview of the Salaries Review Commission

The President of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago has conveyed his approval for a review by the Salaries Review Commission of the travelling facilities applicable to holders of offices within the Commission's purview.

2. The existing travelling facilities provided to office holders vary according to the status of the office as well as the duties performed. However, the main components originally comprised loans to facilitate the purchase of a motor vehicle and to cover the cost of Motor Vehicle Insurance Premiums, a Chauffeur Allowance and a Commuted Travelling Allowance.

3. In our Twenty-seventh Report, we reviewed the arrangements for the payment of the Chauffeur Allowance. Consequently, this Report addresses all components except the Chauffeur Allowance.

MOTOR VEHICLE LOAN

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4. In our Twenty-third Report, we had recommended that the maximum loan to facilitate the purchase of a motor vehicle should be revised to \$50,000 and that the rate of interest applicable thereto should be set at 6% per annum. These recommendations were accepted and took effect from January 1, 1993.

5. Since that time, however, the Commission has observed that the prices of motor vehicles have increased considerably as a result of the higher price of vehicles on the international market as well as the flotation of the Trinidad and Tobago currency in April, 1993.

6. An examination of current motor vehicle prices reveals that the Showroom Prices of vehicles range between \$51,000 for models at the lower end of the scale and \$215,000 for more acclaimed models. These differences have caused us to reflect once again on the principle of providing executive compensation for top offices within our purview which we espoused in our last general review.

7. Bearing this principle in mind and taking into consideration the varying levels of office-holders involved, we are of the opinion that in recommending a revised loan ceiling, a distinction should be made between senior officials and other office holders.

8. The senior officials to whom we refer include Ministers of Government and other Parliamentarians, members of the Judiciary, Permanent Secretaries, chief legal officers and other officials of equivalent status.

9. We recommend a revised maximum loan of \$100,000 for senior officials and \$75,000 for other office-holders who are eligible for car loans. Appendix I sets out the schedule of offices and the recommended loan ceilings to be applied. The existing rate of interest of 6% per annum applicable to these loans should be maintained.

10. We have noted that a distinction has continued to be made between the quantum of the loan provided in respect of standard grade vehicles (i.e. cubic capacity of more than 1.3 litres) and light grade vehicles (i.e cubic capacity of 1.3 litres and less). We have observed, however, that there is now minimal differential between the cost of a light grade vehicle and certain standard grade vehicles. Consequently, we are of the view that there is no need to continue to maintain a distinction in the provision of loans for the purchase of standard and light grade motor vehicles.

11. With regard to the repayment periods for motor vehicle loans, we have observed that these are set at 5 years in the case of a standard grade vehicle and 4 1/2 years for a light grade vehicle. The existing repayment period of 5 years compares favourably with arrangements in the commercial sector where the payback period is 4 years for new cars and 2 to 3 years for used cars. For a 5 year period, instalments are estimated to range between \$1,450 per month and \$1,920 per month for loans of \$75,000 and \$100,000 respectively. Given these levels of instalments, we recommend that the repayment period be extended to 6 years. The instalments would then range between \$1,245 per month to \$1,645 per month.

Motor Vehicle Insurance Premium

12. At present, office-holders are entitled to loans repayable over a period of ten (10) months to cover the cost of motor vehicle insurance premiums. We consider that the existing provision is adequate and that it should be maintained.

Commuted Travelling Allowance/Travel Allowance

13. The existing Commuted Travelling Allowance payable to the majority of office-holders within our purview is set at \$750 per month. In the light of increases in the cost of maintaining vehicles since this allowance was implemented in 1993 and taking account of the levels of travelling allowances paid in the economy in general, we recommend that a revised rate of \$1,200 per month should be paid to office-holders (excluding holders of Parliamentary offices) who have been identified for a motor vehicle loan of \$100,000. For those office-holders for whom a loan of \$75,000 has been recommended, the revised Commuted Travelling Allowance should be set at \$900 per month.

14. In our Twenty-third Report, we had recommended the rationalisation and simplification of the travelling allowances paid to Parliamentarians. This was accepted and a single monthly Travel Allowance was introduced in place of the payment of a Special Travel Allowance in addition to a monthly Commuted Travelling Allowance. The existing Travel Allowance ranges between \$800 per month for members of the Senate (other than Ministers and Parliamentary Secretaries) to \$1,800 per month, payable to the Prime Minister and Ministers of Government. We recommend that the Travel Allowances for Parliamentarians be revised as set out in Appendix II.

15. Varying amounts of Commuted Travelling Allowances are also paid to members of certain Commissions and Boards and Assemblymen and Councillors of the Tobago House of Assembly. In the case of Local Government officials, a Travel Allowance is payable. We recommend that these allowances should also be revised. The proposed rates are included in Appendix II.

16. All revised travelling facilities should take effect from March 1, 1995.

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In summary, we recommend as follows:-

- (i) The existing Motor Vehicle Loan of \$50,000 should be revised to \$75,000 and \$100,000 as specified in Appendix I;
- (ii) The rate of interest of 6% per annum applicable to Motor Vehicle Loans should be maintained;
- (iii) The existing distinction between standard grade vehicles and light grade vehicles should be eliminated;
 - (iv) The repayment period for Motor Vehicle Loans should be extended to 6 years;
 - (v) The existing arrangement with regard to the provision of loans to cover Motor Vehicle Insurance Premiums should be maintained;
- (vi) The existing Commuted Travelling Allowances payable to office-holders within our purview and Travel Allowances payable to Parliamentarians and Local Government officials should be revised as specified in Appendix II;
- (vii) The revised travelling facilities should take effect from March 1, 1995.
